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From Tuskegee to Covid-19: U.S. Program of Black Genocide Is Unchanged

rom the very start of the U.S. Government's coronavirus operation, Black people had serious doubts about what they were witnessing. At one moment, early in the alleged pandemic, the infection appeared to be affecting Whites solely to the point that Blacks believed they may actually be Covid-resistant. But soon the government and the media began flooding the airwaves with claims that Blacks were in fact the most vulnerable of all population groups, and that they were dying at higher rates.

Even amidst that sobering news, Black people were deeply suspicious of a government and medical industry that had mistreated and abused them since slavery. They resisted being tested and refused participation in the vaccine trial programs in greater numbers than others. Many of the top health officials, politicians, and corporate heads were filmed condemning those past medical abuses and reassuring their ex-slaves that they had learned their racial lesson and that such atrocities would not-indeed could not-happen again. Though totally silent or hostile to Blacks on the even more devastating issues of rampant police murders, the crack epidemic, diabetes and heart disease, among many other scourges, these government and Big Pharma officials insisted that Whites were totally reformed and now can be trusted.

They specifically referenced the most infamous example of White medical wickedness: the Tuskegee syphilis "experiment," a forty-year atrocity in which Black men in Alabama were used by government doctors to spread the deadly and contagious disease of syphilis around the Black population of the South. When the secret program was exposed in 1972 the *Muhammad Speaks* newspaper headline accurately expressed Black America's collective outrage: WHITE ANIMALITY, BLACK GENOCIDE: CRIMINAL EXPERIMENT AT TUSKEGEE.

Dr. Anthony Fauci, the U.S.

Government's lead doctor in their Covid operation, admitted that "the history of the African American population with medical researching is not a very good history, dating back to the now shameful Tuskegee experiments. ..." New York governor Andrew Cuomo told a Black church, "The Tuskegee experiment is a terrible stain on the soul of this nation." 

mented on during the terrible Tuskegee time." Many other luminaries struck that same repentant tone.

But these were crocodile tears. All of them had an ulterior motive. As they were reaching out to Blacks with the right hand, they had a syringe in their left hand. Their atonement for Tuskegee could not be complete, they said, until we Blacks—all of us—took the needle filled with an untested, experimental toxic waste they claim is a "vaccine."

Blacks were more than "vaccine hesitant." Free do-

nuts, weed, and cash enticements could not tempt them enough to take a "jab." To our wary people, it all had the look of General Amherst's smallpox blankets. They had read up on the string of wicked vaccine experiments perpetrated against many non-White populations around the world. The excellent book "Medical Apartheid," by Harvard's Harriet A. Washington, is a 500-page history of how the medical industry and the U.S. government have repeatedly come to Blacks with claims of healing only to leave us with more sickness, death, and sterility among the survivors.

And this brings us right back to Tuskegee and syphilis. As Satan always does, he leaves tell-tale signs of his racist plotting. Swedish sociologist Gunnar Myrdal gave us the heads-up in his 1944 book "American Dilemma: The Negro Problem and Modern Democracy." "[A]ll white Americans agree that, if the Negro is to be eliminated, he must be eliminated slowly so as not to hurt any living individual Negroes."

nd that is exactly what the Covid-19 serum (it is NOT a vaccine) is intended to do. Indeed, the U.S. government's extraordinary hustle to vaccinate the

world is EXACTLY like the Tuskegee program—except it is more deceitful and far more deadly. By the end of the 40year abomination only 74 of the original 431 test subjects had survived. Officially, 28 of them had died of syphilis, 100 were dead of related complications, 40 of their wives had been infected, and 19 of their children were born with congenital syphilis.

As of this writing the U.S. government has registered 3,544 deaths associated with the experimental fluids of manufacturers Pfizer, Johnson & Johnson, and Modernanearly thirty times the known Tuskegee death toll. Further, these "vaccine" murders have now surpassed by 98 the total number of recorded lynchings in the United States between 1882 and 1968—3,446.

But it is actually worse than that. The crime of Tuskegee was that medical officials withheld a known syphilis cure—penicillin—allowing a deadly and contagious disease to spread among Blacks. And this conspiracy to hide the cure is precisely what made the Tuskegee operation so insidious. "Not only did they withhold treatment," says the victims' attorney Fred Gray, "But they sent these men's names to the various doctors in the area and told them if they came to their office, not

to treat them for syphilis."

The director in the Tuskegee program was a doctor named Sydney Olansky. He was interviewed in 1992, and when asked about the lies that were told to the Black men of Tuskegee, Dr. Olansky said: "The fact that they were illiterate was helpful, too, because they couldn't read the newspapers. If they were not, as things moved on they might have been reading newspapers and seen what was going on."

The EXACT same is true with the American government's Covid-19 "Vaccination" program! Known and proven successful preventatives and

COVID Sterilization Program?

There is yet more that makes this satanic "vaccine" program nothing more than a Tuskegee rerun. The "authorities" will never fess up to the actual aim of the Tuskegee program. They say it was to "study the effects of untreated syphilis," but that is a ruse. One devastating effect of syphilis is STERILIZATION. Fannie Lou Hamer was a victim of forced sterilization, which became so common in the South that they called it a "Mississippi appendectomy."


Subject's wife interjected that the nurse had said government doctors were coming from the north and had suggested that he join the program. Later

The doctors gave them pills and medicines and shots--hip and arm mostly. He didn't know why they were giving him shots. The doctor told him he had a bad heart, bad circulation, arthritis. He also had falling spells.

Lots of people went to the clinic with him. He didn't know them all. They all got the same medicine. Nobody ever said anything about his blood. They never told them what was wrong with them. They got a lot of pills. He took some of the pills, not all. He had never been hospitalized before his operation for cataracts. He took a lot of home remedies. Nurse would tell him to come in and get checked over. He saw different doctors over the years. Sometimes private doctors. When he went to private doctors, he had to pay. He didn't know if they knew he was in the program.

The doctor (he was seeing) now said his blood was good. He had had different shots over the years. Some hip shots. He didn't know if he had ever heard of penicillin or if he had ever had any. He said he had never heard of syphilis. He had heard of "bad blood" but didn't know what it meant.

riberies masking as "incentives" are still being pushed as millions simply refuse, don't trust or don't want experimental Covid-19 vaccines.

The growing list of these trinkets being used to entice desperate people, and quell questions and concerns violate long held notions against paying people to make medical decisions.

Don't fall for the tricks. And there are plenty of tricks masking as treats out there: Ohio is selling people on the "Ohio Vax-a-million" state lottery and plans to give away \$1 million to five adults and full scholarships to teens who get the shot. Money for "Ohio Vax-a-Million" will come from existing federal coronavirus relief funds, according to state officials.

The Kentucky Lottery is giving away coupons for a free Cash Ball game ticket to adults who get their first or second vaccine shot at Kroger or Walmart stores.

You can add to that snacks and food such as rice, cookies, crackers, chips and commissary packages the Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services is offering to beguile inmates into getting the so-called vaccine.

West Virginia is offering \$100 savings bonds to 16-35 year-olds.

New Jersey is offering residents 21 and over who get vaccinated free beer for a shot.

The state of Maine is offering free hunting or fishing licenses, and LL Bean gift cards or other prizes to residents who get their shots by Memorial Day.

"That is good old-fashioned bribery," said Debra Furr-Holden, a professor of public health at Michigan State University, in a recent article published by www. bridgemi.com/. "Most people would do anything for a million dollars and that's not the (reason) we want them to get the vaccine."

"Furr-Holden said researchers can only offer nominal rewards to subjects for studies because the reward cannot be so big that participants are blinded to the potential risks," the article explained. Dr. Furr-Holden told the news outlet the "million-dollar vaccine lottery obliterates that equation."

"It's too big of a carrot," she said. "It takes choice out of it. It's coercive."

Bryan Towey, in Forbes magazine earlier this year, spoke out as founder and CEO of The Bryan Towey Organization. "My organization will not be offering incentives to employees who choose to take the vaccine. The decision to take a vaccine is personal and should not involve outside influences. While many companies may be antsy to get back to normal as soon as possible, getting involved with the medical



decisions of employees is a slippery slope," he said.

Meanwhile, Forbes added, "Get Golden Visa decided against offering incentives. After considering the benefits and disadvantages, Charles Taylor Harris said, '... there are the legal concerns, particularly in a liability-heaven like the U.S. We ultimately decided not to go ahead with a vaccine compensation for our employees in order not to cause any liability issues. ...'

"It won't be long before we start seeing legal ads reading 'If you received the Covid-19 vaccine in 2021, you may be entitled to compensation."

"Another downside, according to Ross at Test Prep Insight, is that a vaccine incentive plan, '...

may upset certain segments of workers. With the politicization of the vaccine, mask policies and the regulatory environment that has evolved around Covid, offering incentives for getting the vaccine may be seen as a political move by some employees,' "Forbes poted

Emily A. Largent, J.D., Ph.D., RN1 and Franklin G. Miller, Ph.D., tackled the subject in a JAMA article. The title of the piece was "Problems With Paying People to Be Vaccinated Against COVID-19." JAMA is an American Medical Association journal.

The January article noted that recently "several individuals from across the political spectrum have proposed paying cash incentives for COVID-19 vaccination."

The authors, who weren't anti-vaccine, still cited problems in paying people to play the experimental vaccine game. One issue, "some might feel that a substantial monetary incentive for vaccination is coercive. While this is a misconception that confus-

es an offer with a threat, there is a genuine ethical concern about the influence of such an incentive on decision-making. Offering payment as an incentive for COVID-19 vaccination may be seen as unfairly taking advantage of those U.S. residents who have lost jobs, experienced food and housing insecurity, or slipped into poverty during the pandemic. COVID-19 has shone a spotlight on the substantial inadequacies of the social safety net in the U.S. As individuals and families struggle, some people might feel they must accept a vaccine in order to, for example, purchase food or pay rent. They might feel they have no choice but to be vaccinated for cash. It is deeply problematic that the government would offer cash incentives to promote vaccination when it has failed, in numerous instances throughout this pandemic, to offer money or other supports needed to ensure that the basic needs of many people are being met. This concern may be particularly pronounced in Black and Brown communities, which have been disproportionately affected by both the health and economic consequences of the pandemic.

"Fourth, COVID-19 vaccine hesitancy is rooted in concerns such as the warp speed development and approval of vaccines, politicization of the broader pandemic response, and even denial that the pandemic is real. It is unclear that offering incentive payments can or will overcome apprehensions like these. Rather, cash incentives might reasonably be expected to heighten these apprehensions or raise new ones, as offers of payment are often understood to signal that a behavior is undesirable or risky. In a climate characterized by widespread distrust of government and propensity to endorse conspiracy theories, those who are already COVID-19 vaccine hesitant might perceive that the government would not be willing to pay people to get vaccinated if the available vaccines were truly safe and effective. Incentive payments might also stoke new fears and, perversely, increase resistance to vaccination," they argued.
